2007 proved to be another successful season for Brandon, leading or tying for the team lead in receptions per game twice and leading the team in receiving yards per game twice. He started his career with the Titans during the 2005 NFL season, where he played in ten games and started eight. During that season, he proved himself to be a dangerous late-down receiving threat with 18 of his 23 career receptions going for first downs and two of them for touchdowns. In 2006, after recovering from a knee injury, his teammates voted him the winner of the Ed Block Courage Award, for his fortitude.



A true athlete, Jones was drafted by the New York Yankees in 2001, but instead accepted a scholarship to the University of Oklahoma in order to enhance his skills and pursue a football career. Brandon splits his time between Nashville and his hometown of Texarkana, Texas.
